

**American Chamber of Commerce
in Germany**

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The American Chamber of Commerce in Germany e.V. (AmCham Germany) is a private, non-profit, bilateral economic organization that represents the interests of its 3,000 American and German members. Our mission is to further the competitiveness of Germany as an investment location, promote trade and investment between Germany and the United States and strengthen transatlantic relations.

AmCham Germany was founded in Berlin on 30 January 1903 as the American Chamber of Commerce. At the outset there were around 100 members, of which approximately 60% were American citizens and 40% German. AmCham Germany is the oldest bilateral trade association in Germany and the second oldest AmCham in the world. Today, with over 3,000 members, AmCham Germany is the largest American Chamber of Commerce in Europe. AmCham Germany's membership includes 85% of all U.S. investment in Germany, accounting for approximately 800,000 direct jobs and over 130 billion Euro in investment.

AmCham Germany's goals are to support unrestricted trade and investment between the United States and Germany, and to promote a healthy, open and productive business climate between the two countries. AmCham Germany represents the business interests of American firms located in Germany and the United States and also acts on behalf of its German members, many of whom maintain significant holdings in the United States.
